

### **Annual Outcome Data Report**

Within the Department of Family Sciences, at Texas Woman's University, two Counseling Programs are accredited by the Council for the Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP, 2009): Master of Science with an emphasis in Clinical Mental Health Counseling and Master of Science in School Counseling.

### **2019-2020 Program Graduates**

In the 2019-2020 academic year twenty-seven students graduated from the Texas Woman's University's Counseling and Development program. Of the twenty-seven, nine were in the School Counseling Program and eighteen were in the Clinical Mental Health Program.

Both the Clinical Mental Health and School Counseling Tracks require the completion of 61 semester hours at the graduate level. During the 2019-2020 school year, neither program experienced student withdrawals or non-completers. The programs both demonstrated a 100% completion rate for students on track to graduate during this time.

### **Currently Enrolled Students**

At the end of the 2019-2020 academic year, the Clinical Mental Health Counseling Program currently has 85 students enrolled while the Professional School Counseling Program has 25 students currently enrolled. Both programs have a fairly even distribution of students across the time-span of the graduate program.

### **Record of Test Performance**

The majority of students who graduated in 2019-2020 and have taken the National Counselor Examination for Licensure have passed the exam; the overall pass rate for Texas Woman's University is an estimated 95%. Students in the Professional School Counseling Program have passed the TExES Exam with 100% pass rate.

### **Acceptance Rate**

Of the applicants interviewed and evaluated over the past calendar year, about 60% have been offered admission. The admission process includes an evaluation of credentials, essays, as well as both group and individual interviews.
