

## Annual Outcome Data Report 2021

Annual Outcome Data Report Within the Department of Family Sciences, at Texas Woman's University, two Counseling Programs are accredited by the Council for the Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP, 2009): Master of Science with an emphasis in Clinical Mental Health Counseling and Master of Science in School Counseling.

2019-2020 Program Graduates In the 2020-2021 academic year 44 students graduated from the Texas Woman's University's Counseling and Development program. Of the 44, 8 were in the School Counseling Program and 36 were in the Clinical Mental Health Program. Both the Clinical Mental Health and School Counseling Tracks require the completion of 61 semester hours at the graduate level.

During the 2020-2021 year, the Clinical Mental Health Program experienced one withdrawal due to illness, but the student plans to return to the program in the Summer of 2022. The programs both demonstrated a 100% completion rate for students on track to graduate during this time.

Based on self-report of former students, 100% of students who graduated in 2020-2021 that have taken the National Counselor Examination for Licensure have passed the exam. Students in the Professional School Counseling Program have passed the TExES Exam with an estimated 97% pass rate, based on former student self-report. Acceptance rate of the applicants interviewed and evaluated over the past calendar year, dropped to 24.9%, as we had a record number of applicants. The admission process includes an evaluation of credentials, essays, as well as both group and individual interviews.

Based on self-report from former students 6 months post-graduation, our students have an estimated 100% employment rate in both the clinical mental health program and school counseling program.
