## **Guidelines**

**\*Evening and weekend** final exams will begin at the usual class time during exam week.

**To reserve classrooms for final exams for any courses not represented in the above listing,** such as internet courses, hybrid courses, televideo courses, etc., faculty must contact University Scheduling several weeks in advance of final exams.

**Final examination dates cannot be changed.** As stated in the TWU Faculty Handbook, students should check the examination schedule when they register for a class to determine when their exams end. The only exceptions to this rule are made when a student has three examinations on one day, presents proof of personal illness, or cites a family emergency that can be verified. In such cases, the student may petition the department chair or dean for examination change(s).

**Instructors are not free to dismiss a class or part of a class from the final examination period.** Some classes (such as clinical, individual study, or practicum class) may not have a cumulative final examination, but in all cases the instructor should be aware that the period assigned for the final examination is included in calculating the time required for the class.
