Our four winners of the Graduate Student Appreciation Scholarship will be announced soon along with the winners of the photo contest. Voting closed at noon for the photo contest, and we had a lot of great submissions; hopefully, you had a chance to see them. Nearly 100 faculty and staff submitted encouraging messages. Every day last week, we sent an email to students with those messages. Graduate students let us know they really appreciated these messages of support, so thank you! ### **Graduate Applications and Preregistrations**

Summer: Master's application acceptances are up 37% (97 students) and pre registration is up 46% (61 students). Doctoral acceptances are up 3% (6 students) and pre registration is flat.

Fall: Master's application acceptances are up 56% (80 students) and pre registration is up 52% (54 students).

Doctoral acceptances are flat (201 vs 202 for 2024 vs 2025, respectively, so a one student difference). Pre-registered students are down -76% (54 students).

Comment Theme	Frequency	Notes
Missing or Incorrect RCR (Responsible Conduct of Research)	10+ cases	Frequently flagged and resolved after uploading correct documentation.
No or Inadequate Committee Service Listed on CV	~6 cases	Often led to initial rejections or rework; corrected CVs were uploaded.
Need for Updated or Corrected CV	~6 cases	Often related to terminal degree, committee experience, or course listings.
Terminal Degree Not Listed / Not Clear	~3 cases	Affected endorsement validity (e.g., Full endorsement not allowed without terminal degree).
