Happy 2025! Hope your semesters have gotten off to a good start!

Enrollment

I've got a good news/bad news report, and I'll start with bad news because I always like to end with good news.

Overall, spring enrollment is down (as of day 3 reports by IRDM) by 2.6% (-134 students). Most of this decline is at the master's level.

New enrollment is up by +14% (69 students). Most of this increase is also at the master's level.

Unfortunately, this is not enough to back fill our losses. To put it in perspective, 4,420 of our graduate students enrolled this spring are continuing, and 548 are new.

Furthermore, 76% of our students are master's students. Most master's students finish in two to three years. This is a pipeline that we need to keep refilling quickly. We are taking a deep dive looking at our enrollment, communication, and application processes to see what we can improve. There have been meetings with college leadership, enrollment management, marketing and communication, institutional research, and the provost to see how we can strengthen our enrollment. I've been at the majority of those meetings, and one issue that has surfaced is we are seeing a decline in a few of our larger master's programs, so that is obviously going to impact our overall enrollment. That said, this spurred some good conversation and action items.

Professional Development

We are in the process of planning spring Zoom sessions for students, as well as faculty and staff, so more information about that will be coming soon.

Apply for Graduation

Next week, we will be sending reminders to students to apply for graduation. The deadline is **January 29**. Every year, we have a few students who miss this deadline. If you can also remind your students, that would be helpful too.

Admissions Department Update

Graduate and undergraduate admissions are now separate departments. Graduate admissions will have a dedicated committee that will be working with graduate students.

Recurring Issue

Graduate students who are in dissertation or thesis hours do not receive letter grades or pass/fail grades. The only grading system for them is PR for In Progress and CR for earned credit for that term

If a student is in 5983/6983 (master's or PhD), they need to have their prospectus approved with IRB and then the Graduate School before they can move on to the next semester, 5993/6993. If they do not have an approved prospectus on file, they will receive a notification that they will be administratively removed from their enrollment because they do not qualify, and it will be too late for them to enroll in something else.

Graduation applications

Remind students to apply for graduation.

We currently have over 800 applications for the spring with only 28 dissertations and 9 thesis.
