We have developed the following resource for your easy reference to our current COVID-19 guidance.

COVID-19 Policy

The health and well-being of our families and staff are our highest priorities. In the interest of limiting the opportunity for transmission, we are taking the following precautionary measures:

Your household must remain out of the center if any member of your household has:

- a) A suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19
- b) Has been in close contact with a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19
- c) Or is under quarantine due to travel pursuant to CDC guidelines.

14 days after the last potential exposure, your household may return **provided these three things have happened:**

- a) At least 10 days have passed since any household member first experienced symptoms; **and**
- b) Symptoms have improved for any household member that experienced symptoms (for example, cough or shortness of breath has improved); **and**
- c) The household has been fever-free for at least 72 hours without the use of fever-reducing medicines.

Please note, depending on the circumstances we may require you to obtain medical clearance before return to the center (see Illness policy).

HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS: include individuals who may not live in the household but may be staying there or are otherwise present in the household on a regular basis (e.g. nannies, caregivers, home health workers, etc.) and includes anyone with pick up or drop off privileges at the center.

CLOSE CONTACT: is defined by the CDC as (1) being within approximately 6 feet (2 meters) of a suspected or confirmed COVID-19 case for a prolonged period of time (greater than 10 minutes, cumulatively and can occur while caring for, living with, visiting, or sharing a health care waiting area or room with a COVID-19 case, or (2) having direct contact with infectious secretions of a COVID-19 case (e.g., being coughed on). Considerations when assessing close contact include the duration of exposure and the clinical symptoms of the person with COVID-19.

FOR MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS: If contact occurs while wearing recommended personal protective equipment or PPE (e.g., gowns, gloves, NIOSH-certified disposable N95 respirator, eye protection), that contact will NOT be considered close contact for purposes of this policy.

SUSPECTED OR CONFIRMED CASE OF COVID – 19: An individual who has tested positive (confirmed); An individual who has been diagnosed by a healthcare provider with COVID-19 without performing testing (suspected); An individual who is showing signs and symptoms of COVID-19 (cough, fever/chills, shortness of breath, fatigue, body aches, headache, loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion/runny nose, nausea/vomiting, or diarrhea) without having been tested or seen by a doctor themselves (suspected)

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Health Check and Illness Policy - COVID 19

Applies to staff, children and their household members, which states in part:

ALL STAFF, FAMILIES, CHILDREN AND THEIR HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS MUST CONDUCT A DAILY HEALTH CHECK BEFORE COMING TO THE CENTER.

- Should you or any household member have any of the following symptoms, we ask you to remain out that day and notify the center.
 - Fever of 100.4 F or higher, now or in the preceding 72 hours
 - Cough
 - Sore Throat
 - Muscle Aches
 - Difficulty Breathing
 - Loss of Taste or Smell
- Consistent with our COVID-19 Policy, the household will be required to remain out of the center for at least 14 days unless medical clearance is provided by a physician indicating that the presenting symptoms are associated with a known non-COVID-19 illness. The physician's note must be from the child's pediatrician (or for family members, a physician note must come from a physician outside of the family).
- If a physician confirms that your child is ill with a non-COVID-19 illness, they may return to the center when they have been symptom free for 24 hours without medication as per our regular school illness policy.

ALL STAFF AND CHILDREN WILL BE SCREENED PRIOR TO ENTERING THE CENTER AND AT ANY PRESENTATION OF SYMPTOMS.

- Staff and children will be screened using the following methods:
 - Visual inspection for signs of infection which could include flushed cheeks, fussiness, lethargy, cough, etc.
 - Temperature will be taken
- If your child becomes sick at school, they will be isolated from the group and kept comfortable until they are picked up. All sick children must be picked up with 30 minutes of notification.

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SUMMARY OF ENHANCED PROTOCOLS.

We are continually updating our processes and protocols in accordance with the most recent Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidance and the guidance of medical experts.

At your center, you will notice:

- **Daily health check** for Staff and children before entering the center.
- **Non-essential visitors** are not allowed into the center.
- **Drop-offs/pick-ups** taking place at the back door of the clubhouse near the playground area, with children escorted to their classroom. Times may be staggered.
- **Hygiene/handwashing** emphasized throughout the day.
- **Masks** worn by staff and children over 2 years inside the building, when feasible.
- **Reduced class sizes**, as determined by local guidance, in consistent groupings with consistent staffing as possible. Current guidance suggests groups no larger than 10 (including teachers).
Classes will not be combined.
- **Social distancing being practiced** as much as possible, including at meal times.
- **Removal** of classroom toys, materials and items that are hard to clean.
- **Frequent cleaning and disinfecting** of high touch surfaces and toys.
- **Increased time spent outside.**
- **One group at a time in each playground area**, sanitizing in between groups.
