Highlights

IPE Activities & Programming

- Occupational Therapy and Nursing faculty on the Denton campus organized a brandnew Safe Patient Handling IPE event. This IPE activity engaged second-year OT students in teaching body mechanics, safe patient handling, mobility, and transfers to junior nursing and first-year OT students, promoting communication and collaboration in shared areas of clinical care. - 434 student participants and 56 faculty facilitators from TWU Nursing, Social Work, SLP, OT, and PT programs participated in *Convergence*, an IPE initiative organized by UT Southwestern which provides students the chance to learn about, from, and

- with one another in small interdisciplinary groups. Other participating universities include the UT Southwestern Medical School, UT Southwestern School of Health Professions, UT Arlington College of Nursing and Health Innovation, and Texas Tech University School of Pharmacy.
- UNT Health invited TWU and UT Arlington students to join the first of four virtual IPE
 workshops introducing the IPEC Competencies to small, mixed groups of SLP, PT,
 Social Work, and Dietetics. Facilitators will reconnect with their students this fall and
 twice in the spring to address all four IPEC competencies.
