### What are the criteria for admission?

- Eligibility to the Texas Woman's University (TWU) College of Nursing (CON) requires
  a cumulative GPA and nursing prerequisite GPA of 3.0 or higher, as well as a score of
  64 or above in each TEAS section. Eligible students must complete the entire
  NursingCAS application and submit a criminal background check through
  Castlebranch.
- Admission to the College of Nursing (CON) is highly competitive. As part of the
  process, the Admissions Committee will review all responses in application,
  including short answers to questions about leadership experiences and selfassessment of personal traits such as caring, and resilience.

### When are the application deadlines?

August 15th for Spring admission February 1st for Fall admission

#### By the application deadline, you must have:

- ♦ Completed nursing prerequisite coursework as listed in the blue box to the left.
- ◆ Gained admission to TWU. If not already a TWU student, apply through www.ApplyTexas.org and select "Nursing Entry BS" as your intended major.
- ♦ Submitted your application to upper-division nursing through <u>www.NursingCAS.org.</u>
- ♦ Uploaded an official TEAS score report to the NursingCAS application. Visit <a href="https://www.ATItesting.com">www.ATItesting.com</a> for more details.
- ♦ Ensured that updated official transcripts from previous institutions are sent to Admissions Processing in Denton and NursingCAS. All college credits must be entered into NursingCAS.

RE: Requirements for Clinical Placement and Subsequent Registered Nursing Licensure

#### **Clinical Placement**

All potential students seeking entrance to the TWU College of Nursing Upper Division program should be aware of requirements necessary for clinical placement during the nursing curriculum and subsequent requirements for licensure. Nursing students gain expertise in nursing care by attending required clinical experiences at hospitals and other clinical agencies in community. By providing direct patient care throughout the nursing curriculum, the student develops necessary knowledge, skills, and critical thinking abilities in order to competently perform as a registered nurse applicant upon graduation. When students are placed in clinical agencies to complete necessary course work each semester, the students must comply with strict entrance criteria, to include, but not limited to, criminal background screening and drug testing, imposed by that particular clinical agency. TWU College of Nursing must ensure and verify that each student placed in a clinical facility meets those requirements. Currently, students MUST meet very specific identification requirements (valid ID) in order to have drug testing and criminal background screening to attend clinical experiences and successfully pass clinical courses in the curriculum. The following list contains the only acceptable identification necessary for the drug testing and criminal background screening. One of the following will be required of all students who have been admitted to upper division nursing before a clinical placement can be offered. You must present one of these forms of identification on the day designated as nursing orientation.

- Unexpired US/Texas Driver's License with photo
- Unexpired United States passport with photo
- Unexpired Foreign passport with Student Visa and photo
- United States State ID [Texas ID] issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles with photo
- United States Citizenship Certificate or Certificate of Naturalization with identifiable photo
- Unexpired United States military ID card for active duty, reserve, or retired personnel with photo

#### **Background Checks for Texas Board of Nursing**

Per Senate Bill (SB) 1058, criminal background checks are **mandatory** for all students accepted for enrollment in a nursing education program. These checks, initiated by the Texas Board of Nursing, are

intended to identify individuals who, due to criminal convictions, would be ineligible to sit for the NCLEX exam upon completion of an approved nursing education program. Those who believe they might have eligibility issues to be found through a criminal background check that could prevent them from taking the licensure examination upon completion of a nursing program are required to complete a Declaratory Order application. The Declaratory Order process permits the Board of Nursing to make decisions regarding an applicant's eligibility for licensure prior to entering or completing a nursing program. This process must be fulfilled before a clinical placement can be granted in any clinical nursing course.

#### Testing Center Requirements for Licensure Testing (for graduates seeking RN licensure)

Future nursing graduates should also know that PSI (the testing company assigned to provide NCLEX-RN examinations required for licensure) requires a valid ID containing an identifiable photo and signature. For more information on requirements for testing for licensure, go to:
