Upon admission, transfer credit will be considered on a course-by-course basis by the Core Faculty. Documentation of the course(s) (e.g. course descriptions from graduate catalogs, syllabi, texts and readings) for which students seek transfer credit must be submitted. Practicum credits from other universities will not be transferred. The Graduate School allows up to 50% of a doctoral program's course work to be transfer credit. Students entering with a Master's degree in Counseling Psychology or Counseling often receive substantial transfer credit, typically reducing time to completion by 1 year. The program admits students from both Bachelor's and Master's level.
