IV. Presentation

Ms. Lisa Rampy, Interim Vice President for University Advancement, recommended approval of the naming of The Stroke Center – Dallas. Dr. Jyutika Mehta, Professor and Director of The Stroke Center – Dallas, provided information to the Board related to the donor, Mr. Mike A. Myers and his foundation, the Mike A. Myers Foundation, and the Stroke Center – Dallas. Ms. Rampy then read a Resolution naming The Stroke Center – Dallas the Mike A. Myers Stroke Center in honor of Mr. Mike A. Myers and the Mike A. Myers Foundation. Mr. Myers addressed the Board and stated he was honored to be here and delighted to be involved in TWU.

<u>Motion to Approve Item A:</u> Regent Wu motioned and Regent Wilson seconded. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

Regent McDavid thanked Mr. Myers for his support of TWU. She stated on behalf of the Texas Woman's University System's Board of Regents that the Board was deeply grateful for his generous gift to TWU. The Regents expressed their appreciation of Mr. Myers' gift to TWU.

The meeting recessed at 9:37 a.m.

At the conclusion of the recess, Regent McDavid reconvened the meeting of the Full Board into open session, a quorum being present at 9:52 a.m.

Chancellor Carine M. Feyten officially announced that Mr. Myers' gift was for two million dollars and thanked Mr. Myers for his significant and transformational gift.

Item B. Report on Promotion and Tenure Faculty Highlights

Dr. O. Finley Graves, Interim Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost, presented faculty who were awarded promotion and tenure.

Item C. Report on Texas Woman's University Athletics

Dr. Monica Mendez-Grant, Vice President for Student Life, introduced Ms. Sandee Mott, Director of Athletics, who provided an update on TWU Athletics. Ms. Mott began her report by thanking Regent Amirkhan for her gift to TWU Athletics that she made earlier this spring. She then provided information to the Board related to academic success of TWU student athletes. She highlighted the Artistic Swimming, STUNT, Wrestling, Gymnastics, and Softball teams' successes this year. Ms. Mott then introduced Mrs. Beth Jillson, Head Basketball Coach, and the Pioneer Basketball team to the Board. Mrs. Jillson shared with the Board the success of the 2023 Basketball season and the outstanding support shown by the TWU Community during the team's postseason tournament run. Ms. Ashley Ingram, TWU Basketball student-athlete, presented to the Board her experience as member of TWU's Basketball team.

Item D. Report on Office of Governmental and Legislative Affairs

Mr. Kevin Cruser, Director of Governmental and Legislative Affairs, provided an update on the Office of Governmental and Legislative Affairs. Mr. Cruser began his report by thanking everyone who participates in the legislative process with his office. He then provided information related to TWU's testimony in front of the Texas Senate Subcommittee on Higher Education and the impacts of the FAA Reauthorization Act that was recently passed by the U.S. House of Representatives. Mr. Cruser concluded his report by announcing that Congressman Al Green's office has selected Houston's nursing simulation lab as one of his community projects for the upcoming fiscal year, providing a million dollars of new equipment for the lab.

VI. Report on the Office of the Chancellor and President

Chancellor Carine M. Feyten, Chancellor and President, presented to the Board. Chancellor Feyten provided information related to recent events, TWU successes, and various other updates to the Board. She concluded her report by stating that every day is an adventure but she cannot imagine a better place to adventure with than Texas Woman's and the Board.

VII. Adjourn Full Board Meeting to Executive Closed Session

Regent McDavid then announced that the Board would recess to Executive Closed Session for Deliberations Regarding Personnel Matters Relating to Appointment, Employment, Evaluation, Reassignment, Duties, Discipline, or Dismissal of Public Officers or Employees pursuant to Section 551.074 of the Texas Government Code. Specifically, she stated that the Board would engage in Consultation regarding TWU Administration.

Regent McDavid announced that the Board would also recess to Executive Closed Session for Consultation with Attorney Regarding Legal Matters and/or Contemplated Litigation or Settlement Offers pursuant to Section 551.071 of the Texas Government Code. Specifically, she stated that the Board would hear a recommendation to approve revisions to Regent Policy B.20005: Freedom of Speech and Expression Policy and engage in Consultation with Counsel Regarding Legal Matters, Including Pending, Threatened, and Contemplated Litigation and Settlement Offers.

The meeting adjourned at 10:45 a.m.

VIII. Reconvene into Open Session and Take Any Possible Action Regarding Matters Discussed in Executive Closed Session

At the conclusion of the Executive Closed Session, Regent McDavid reconvened the meeting of the Full Board into open session, a quorum being present at 11:38 a.m. Regent McDavid stated the Board would take any possible action regarding matters discussed in Executive Closed Session.

Motion to Move Approval of Item B.1 Recommend Approval of Revisions to Regent Policy B.20005: Freedom of Speech and Expression Policy: Regent Shepard motioned, and Regent Hyde seconded. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

Regent McDavid acknowledged that Regent Jill Jester is resigning her position to accept a new role as a Denton City Council member. Regent McDavid thanked Regent Jester for her service on the Board. Regent Jester stated that it has been one of the highlights of her life to serve on this Board. Chancellor Carine M. Feyten thanked Regent Jester for her service to TWU and stated that she knows Regent Jester will do great work at the city level for the Denton community. The Regents also expressed their gratitude of Regent Jester's service to the Board.

Chancellor Carine M. Feyten recognized Dr. O. Finley Graves, Interim Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost, for his contributions to TWU. Dr. Graves stated that it has been a privilege. The Regents then thanked Dr. Graves for his service to TWU.

Regent McDavid asked if there were any comments or requests from any Regents regarding future issues or subjects to discuss.
