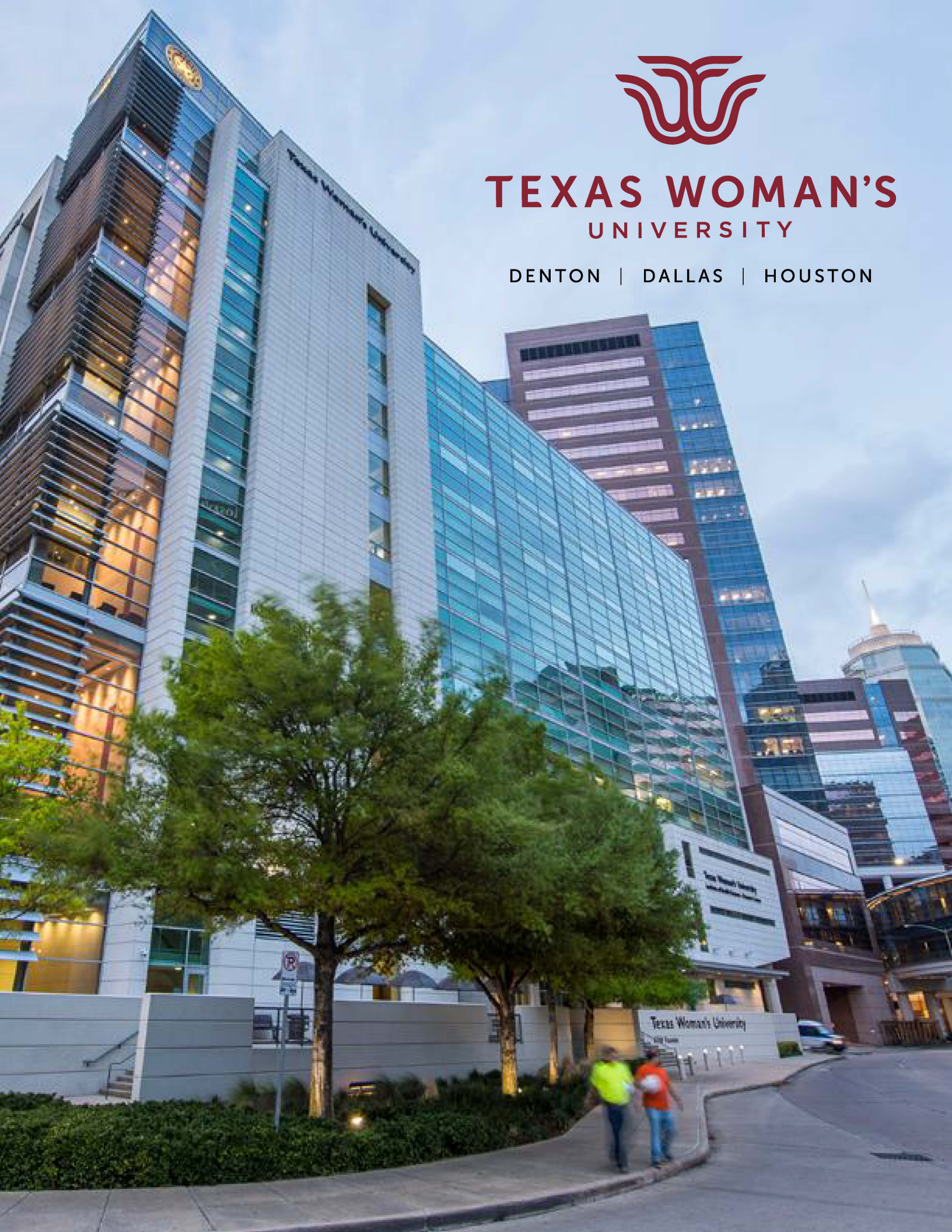

BADGES

Your TWU badge/ID is an essential part of your daily uniform and helps our DPS officers ensure that only TWU students are accessing restricted rooms and equipment. With the heightened level of security throughout the Texas Medical Center (TMC), everyone is expected to wear a photo ID badge. In addition to entering the TWU building and other areas inside, your ID badge will allow you to make use of the University of Texas Health Services for medical treatment and the TMC Library.

Wearing your badge helps identify you as part of the TWU community and enables you to access the building doors on the Fannin Street side (during TWU hours of operation) as well as to academic specific areas and the Fitness Center. To get a TWU ID Badge:

- Complete the form found in the camera room
- Show valid picture ID (driver's license or passport)
- Show proof of enrollment at TWU (class schedule or receipt for payment)

Note: Replacement IDs are \$25. Your student account will be charged. If the fee is not paid, a block will be placed on your account.

BURSAR/BILLING

The Bursar's Office at TWU is responsible for managing student account receivables and depositing funds for the University. The department is centralized and located on the Denton campus. Using WebAdvisor through Pioneer Portal, you can aptly manage billing, but you will need to communicate with them if you have questions regarding payment plans, payment deadlines or refunds. Installment Payments

Installment payments are available through the Pay Online feature in Pioneer Portal or from the TWU Homepage under Pay for Classes, but you must sign up for it to be eligible. All payment plans have an installment fee and late fees assessed for missed payments.

Fall and Spring Installment Plans require a 25 percent down payment of total semester charges plus installment fee. The remaining balance is split into three payments that are due at one-month intervals during the semester. Fall installment dates are September 15, October 15, and November 15. Spring dates are February 15, March 15, and April 15.

DISABILITY SERVICES FOR STUDENTS (DSS)

Disability Services for Students (DSS) ensures that TWU students with disabilities have equitable access to TWU classes, programs and events. We enhance student learning by promoting self-advocacy and partnering with faculty and staff to create a more accessible environment. DSS seeks to advance representation of TWU students with disabilities and establish disability culture as an essential aspect of diversity, vital to society and the TWU community.

Who qualifies for DSS?

It is the policy and practice of Texas Woman's University to comply with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the ADA Amendments Act of 2008. These laws define a disability as a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities. Under these laws, no qualified individual with a disability shall be denied access to or participation in services, programs and activities of Texas Woman's University.

COMPUTERS

The Information Technology (IT) Solutions is here to support you and your technology needs. From maintaining computer labs and classrooms to ensuring wireless access throughout the building, our on site professionals are here to help. In Houston a PC kiosk is located on floors 2 through 8 plus 10, outside the X305 seminar rooms. Rooms 4115, 4310 and 4322 are computer classrooms. You may log on with your TWU credentials to access the Internet and other software.

Computer Lab

Departmental labs are limited to students in specific programs. Each contains audio/visual and technology resources. The PT, OT, and Nursing labs are located on the fifth and sixth floors. There is an open computer lab on the fourth floor. To access the labs, you must be a current student, have a valid ID and have a portal account. Technologies and services available in the lab include:

- 5 LaserJet printers, 101 PCs, 15 Macs and 3 book scanners.
- One color printer is accessible through three scanner stations. Color printing is \$0.40 per page. Follow the instructions located next to the scanner station to print in color.
- Five collaboration spaces are housed inside the computer lab for students working on projects. In four of those collaboration rooms, a 55" TV monitor and a glass dry erase board (dry erase markers can be checked out from the student assistants on duty) are installed. One room is connected via Solstice where students can plug in their own devices.
- A wall mounted charging station is available inside the computer lab for students to charge mobile devices.
- Student assistants are scheduled to be available when the lab is open (student assistants' availability may vary without notice).
- Black and white printing is free to TWU students. Mobile printing is also available in the lab.

FITNESS CENTER

HEALTH CARE

TWU Houston does not have an on-site clinic. Healthcare needs are provided by TWU Denton Student Health Services twu.edu/student-health-services/ and the University of Texas Health Services (UTHS), which has a physical presence at TMC and welcomes visits by TWU students with a valid university ID. UTHS is located at 7000 Fannin Street, Suite 1620 and provides routine physical exams as well as care for illness or injury. They accept most health insurance plans.

Immunizations

Most of the immunizations required for hospital/clinic compliance mandate titers to be drawn. Please plan accordingly as blood test results take time, and booster shots, if necessary, add several more weeks to the requirement before one can be tested again for antibodies. Students needing immunization records for clinicals can check their status and upload information to twu.medicatconnect.com/.

Insurance

TWU Houston Student Life Office acts as a conduit for the student health insurance program available through Academic HealthPlans twu.myahpcare.com/. International students with J-1 or F-1 status are required to maintain continuous health insurance coverage while in the U.S.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT SERVICES

TWU Houston Student Life Office houses a Designated School Official (dunruh@twu.edu) on site to deal with SEVIS related matters for F-1 students. In addition, the office also coordinates the International Student Festival and provides networking support on a number of levels.



LIBRARY

The Houston Center Library (formerly known as the Academic Resource Center) is located on the fourth floor of the Houston campus. It maintains departmental collections and provides a number of services to patrons, including research assistance (either walk-ins or appointments), library instruction, faculty reserves, lending, interlibrary loan services, library workshops and more. Study space with carrels and a separate room has been set aside, and equipment is also available, including a scanner, staplers, hole punchers, a nap pod, audiovisual equipment, phone chargers, headphones, mobile whiteboards and dry erase markers.

You can also register online for remote access to electronic data sources at the largest medical library in Houston, the Texas Medical Center Library at library.tmc.edu/. Select Library Services then scroll to Registering for Library Card Access.

PARKING AND TRANSPORTATION

The Texas Medical Center's (TMC) first priority is to families who need parking near facilities. Students should consider parking on the exterior and using public transportation to reach the campus.

METRO Q Card *(Student Fare - 50% Discount on all Bus and Light Rail Service as well as METRO Park & Ride Lots)*

Students using public transportation may secure their Q Card in Enrollment Services on the 1st floor, Room #1300E. Please bring with you either your TWU ID badge or driver's license, as well as a proof of payment arrangement for tuition and fees.

Before meeting with Enrollment Services staff, please scan the QR code or visit forms.gle/L6bzAK7H2AiXFP4u9 to complete your request.



Houston Methodist

The garage associated with TWU is owned by Houston Methodist Hospital, and has entrances on Main Street as well as "Old Main Street" (a small street between the Bank of America and TWU). When using a map application on your phone, the address to this garage is 6761 Main St.; Houston, TX 77030.

Contract Parking

- Complete the Standard Parking Contract for TWU Students on the TWU DPS site at twu.edu/houston/dps/
- Send the completed contract along with your class schedule (printed from WebAdvisor or secured through the Verification of Enrollment form at twu.edu/registrar/verify-enrollment) to ygemechu@spplus.com. He will notify you by email when you can pick up your parking card.
- If you want to submit the completed contract and class schedule in person, please do so at the TWU garage office across the driveway from the garage elevator lobby on the ground level.
- To pick up your parking card, you will need to show your TWU ID Badge.
- The cost of \$320 per semester (plus a \$15 one-time processing fee for first-time students) must be paid in full when receiving your parking card. NOTE: Standard Parking will ONLY ACCEPT money orders, personal checks and cashier's checks as a payment method.
- Open parking spaces are located on the fourth floor and above. DO NOT park in spaces with gray and white signs: "TWU Reserved Parking". These are for TWU faculty and staff, and all others will be towed at the owner's expense.

Houston Methodist Non-contract (pay-as-you-go) Parking

- 0-20 minutes: free
- 21 minutes – 3 hours: \$7
- 3-4 hours: \$9
- 4-5 hours: \$11
- 5-24 hours: \$13
- Lost ticket: \$13

Fannin South Park & Ride Lot

- Located at 1604 W. Bellfort St. just outside Loop 610 (beyond NRG, behind Sam's)
- Lot Fee: \$3 flat rate/vehicle
- Light Rail into the Texas Medical Center:
 - Without a METRO Q Card, \$2.50 (\$1.25 each way)
 - With a METRO Q Card (allowing half off traditional fare), \$1.20 (\$0.60 each way)

Parking at Latitude

The parking facility can be found at Old Main @ Travis next to the Intercontinental Hotel which is right across from TWU. It is a comfortable 5 minute walk to campus, and is managed by Platinum Parking.

Non-contract Parking

- Visitor parking is available on the 6th floor and above ONLY on a first come, first served basis at a flat rate of \$7.
- No in/out privileges.
- The lot fills up quickly each morning, so it would be wise to arrive by 6:00 a.m. As people leave close to 5 p.m., more spaces become available for evening students.

Contract Parking

- Rate of \$140 a month, with a one-time \$15 processing fee which is non-refundable. Please be advised that a 30-day cancellation notice is required, and the \$140 is for a month-to-month charge.

Texas Medical Center (TMC) contract parking

Parking Off-peak Program (POP) (an option for evening and weekend students)

- Rate of \$95 a month (sales tax NOT included)
- Customers can enter lots AFTER 4:30 p.m. and must exit BEFORE 8 a.m. Monday through Friday, weekends, and TMC holidays.
- The closest parking area to TWU is the AU lot at 2050 Pressler St., Houston, TX 77030.

Contract Parking (for day students)

- Contract parking for day students in TMC lots range from \$100 to \$300 a month, depending on the location (sales tax NOT included).
- Apply by completing a TMC Contract Parking Administration Application.
