## Lone Star College to Texas Woman's University Program to Program Articulation Agreement

Associate of Applied Science in Nursing and Associate of Arts/Science Degree to Bachelor of Science Degree with a Major in Nursing (RN to BS)

This agreement describes various aspects of a joint project to be implemented by the contracting participants: Lone Star College, hereinafter referred to as the "College"; and Texas Woman's University College of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the "University".

#### **OVERALL INTENT**

Whereas the University has baccalaureate programs available in an on-line and other distance learning formats leading to a Bachelor of Science with a major in nursing; and, whereas the College, which provides a certificate, as well as two-year instructional programs leading to an Associate of Applied Science and an Associate of Arts/Science, and serves a specific region of the state where demand for nursing professionals at all levels is high; a collaborative partnership by both institutions will have a two-fold beneficial outcome. By collaborating, the College and University will together address this critical workforce need. By providing the additional education to these nursing professionals, the College and the University will enhance effective delivery of their respective missions by serving the heretofore-unmet health care needs of Texas, potentially involving the College service area.

Specifically, a s a r e s u l t of discussions with University representatives, the College believes it can actively help promote and support the University's distance learning nursing degree programs to the benefit of prospective students in Lone Star College service area. The College's long-standing experience with distance learning delivery systems and pool of prepared transfer students underscores its role as a significant partner in meeting such training needs.

### Services and Functions Performed by the University

Whereas the University has the instructional programs that potentially address the instructional baccalaureate needs of students within the College's service area, it, therefore, agrees to:

Establish a traditional admission process whereby Associate of Applied Science Degree in Nursing students who, in their last semester of course work at Lone Star College, have a 2.5 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale of combined general education prerequisite courses and nursing courses and meet all of the University's admission requirements, including general education requirements, are provisionally assured admission to the RN to BS program. Upon graduation f rom the Associate of Applied Science in Nursing

program, students who have passed NCLEX and are licensed in good standing within the U.S. as a registered nurse, will be admitted unconditionally to the TWU College of Nursing RN to BS Program.

- Establish a concurrent admission process as follows: Pre-Associate of Applied Science Degree
  in Nursing students who, in their first or second semester of course work at Lone Star College
  who have met the following will be granted provisional admission to the University's RN to
  BS Program:
  - Complete a Declaration of Intent with Lone Star College and University
  - Submit an Apply Texas Application and fee, and College of Nursing application and fee (thru
    the Nursing CAS system) to the University
  - Meet all admission requirements for the University and the RN to BS program; including, completion of the College's Associate Degree Nursing program and general education requirements with a 2.5 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale.

Students must pass the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) and be licensed in good standing as a registered nurse within the U.S. to be admitted unconditionally to the University in the RN to BS program. Students admitted to the Associate of Applied Science in Nursing at the College and the University will be classified as "nursing entry" at the University.

- Accept up to 62 SCH general education/core and 28 SCH advanced placement basic nursing courses earned at Lone Star College.
- Provide provisionally admitted students access to TWU library services and TWU online Write-Site program to aid students in their course work and research projects.
- Communicate articulated nursing programs in appropriate publication s to include the TWU web site.
- Provide reasonable assistance to the college for the promotion of the program.

#### Services and Functions Performed by the College:

Whereas Lone Star College has an existing Associate of Applied Science Degree in Nursing educational program, training facilities and clinical placements, it agrees to:

 Advertise the articulated nursing programs in appropriate publications such as, but not limited to the College web page and the Associate Degree Nursing web page. • Designate an individual within the Nursing Division to serve as a liaison for students interested in pursuing the Bachelor of Science with a major in nursing from the University.

#### Other Provisions:

- Both institutions will strive to provide students with "seamless" access to assist them in transferring from the College to the University.
- Each institution will identify an operations contact person to assist in addressing student/advising questions, and help resolve project logistical issues that may develop.
- Representatives from both institutions will confer at least on an annual basis to evaluate the success of this agreement; consider curriculum updates and any other requests for changes or proposed amendments as may be deemed necessary.
- Both institutions agree to share aggregate information on student performance as may be necessary to evaluate the success and quality of the services under this agreement.

#### Terms of This Agreement:

This agreement shall be in effect for a period of two (2) years from the date of the last signature on this Agreement and may be extended and amended for additional one-year terms at any time by written consent of both parties. The total term of this Agreement, including any extensions or amendments, shall not exceed five (5) years.

This agreement may be terminated with thirty (30) days' advance written notification of such intent by one party to the other, but will continue to operate the Program for currently enrolled students. THE UNDERSIGNED CONTRACTING PARTIES do hereby certify that the services specified above are necessary and essential for the activities that are properly within the statutory functions and programs of both Lone Star College and Texas Woman's University.

This curriculum is designed for students who wish to complete or have already completed the Associate of Applied Science in Nursing at Lone Star College, are core complete and completed an AA or AS, and intend to transfer to Texas Woman's University to complete a B.S. in Nursing. This plan includes completion of the core curriculum graduation requirements and additional nursing prerequisites at Lone Star College and TWU graduation requirements.

Students in good standing will be provisionally admitted to the RN BS program and may take NURS 3643 (RN Introduction to Baccalaureate Nursing) and/or BIOL 4344 (Pathophysiology) prior to passing the NCLEX exam. However, they may not progress to NURS 3614 (Nursing Assessment Across the Lifespan) or any other NURS course without first passing the NCLEX exam.

Students must be core complete at Lone Star College and have a minimum grade point average of 2.5 on the required non-nursing lower division courses. If students are not core complete at Lone Star College then they will need to become core complete at TWU. See TWU Undergraduate Catalog for other requirements and deadlines.

- Students jointly admitted to LSC and TWU will receive:
  - o Student ID at LSC & TWU
  - Student computer/internet account at LSC &TWU
  - Student access to computer labs at LSC &TWU
  - Student access to libraries at LSC &TWU
  - o Student access to sporting events at TWU
- All grades, including F's, will be considered for calculation of GPA to determine admission to TWU. If a transferrable course has been taken more than once at another institution, TWU will accept the best grade awarded to the student for that course.
- Students will receive 28 hours credit for the Lone Star College Nursing program curriculum as follows: NURS 3813, 3025, 3035, 4615, 4055, and 4045.

- Reverse transfer of credit from TWU to LSC
- Recognize eligibility for LSC students and employees to apply for transfer scholarship programs
- Students jointly admitted to LSC and TWU will receive:
  - o Student ID at LSC & TWU
  - o Student computer/internet account at LSC &TWU
  - Student access to computer labs at LSC & TWU
  - Student access to libraries at LSC &TWU
  - Student access to sporting events at TWU
- All grades, including F's, will be considered for calculation of GPA to determine admission to TWU. If a transferrable course has been taken more than once at another institution, TWU will accept the best grade awarded to the student for that course.
- Students will receive 28 hours credit for the Lone Star College Nursing program curriculum as follows: NURS 3813, 3025, 3035, 4615, 4055, and 4045.
