Dear Dr. Wheelan:

The purpose of this letter is to notify the Commission on Colleges that Texas Woman's University plans to engage in a partnered agreement with the University of Dallas that will enable participating students to earn two degrees: the Bachelor of Arts (BA) or the Bachelor of Science (BS) degree from the University of Dallas and the Bachelor's degree in Nursing (BSN) from Texas Woman's University. The public-private partnership will produce liberally educated nurses to meet the critical need for health care professionals in Texas.

A transfer articulation agreement has been developed that will enable students beginning their studies at the University of Dallas to take classes meeting general education (Texas core curriculum) and TWU Nursing program prerequisites at the University of Dallas prior to transfer to Texas Woman's University. Students will apply to the TWU College of Nursing during their sophomore year. The partner universities reached agreement on course equivalencies and application processes in spring 2012. Students will be admitted to the program in fall 2013 pending SACS-COC acknowledgement of our notification. A copy of the signed agreement is included.

The teaching locations for the cooperative degree program are the main campus of University of Dallas and the Dallas campus of Texas Woman's University:

DUAL DEGREE PLAN AGREEMENT

TEXAS WOMAN'S UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF NURSING

AND

UNIVERSITY OF DALLAS
CONSTANTIN COLLEGE

I. PURPOSE:

This agreement establishes a public-private partnership that unites the resources of one of the finest nursing programs in the country, that of Texas Woman's University (TWU), with those of one of the country's best liberal arts colleges, the University of Dallas (UD). The University of Dallas students will earn two degrees: the Bachelor of Arts (BA), or the Bachelor of Science (BS), degree in Biology from UD and the BS degree in Nursing from TWU and do so in an integrated program that can be completed in five years. The total number of credit hours in the suggested curriculum is 174, with 100 credit hours taken at UD and 74 credit hours at TWU. Students, in short, will get the benefit of two worlds. The State of Texas in turn will profit from this initiative, which will produce additional liberally-educated health care professionals and do so at a lower cost to state taxpayers than could be done without this public-private partnership.

II ADMISSIONS POLICY AND PROCESS:

- A. A student admitted to the University of Dallas who wishes to participate must notify the chair of the Biology Department and complete a Self-Assessment form for prehealth students.
- B. The student satisfies the following requirements for acceptance into the TWU Nursing Program:
 - 1. The student gets approval from the UD Chair of Biology.
 - The student applies to the TWU Nursing Program, usually during the sophomore year, after having successfully completed the required pre-requisite courses.

III. PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

- A. The student enters the curriculum designed by UD that shall include the minimal course requirements as outlined below by the TWU College of Nursing. The student is encouraged to take as many courses in the sciences as possible but should realize that a strong liberal arts background is important for the development of well-rounded and successful health professions students and practitioners.
- B. Participants in the early admissions program will be assigned an advisor at TWU to provide the student with a personal contact during the initial course of study at UD. The advisor will also aid the student in the timely completion of processes, such as completing TWU College of Nursing admissions procedures.
- C. Following successful completion of the initial pre-requisite courses and enrollment in the final set of pre-requisite courses at UD and TWU, the student will apply for admission to the TWU Nursing Program by February 1 (or the date specified by TWU), normally during the sophomore year.
- D. Students admitted to the TWU Nursing Program will be notified by June 1 (or a date specified by TWU).

- E. For the determination of tuition, fees, room and board costs, and financial aid, students in this program are considered full-time students at UD during years one through three and full-time students at TWU during years four and five. Tuition and fees for students taking classes at TWU during years one through three and at UD for years four and five will be based on the per course rates. The institution in which the student has full-time enrollment is responsible for calculating financial aid, disbursing aid, monitoring satisfactory progress and other student eligibility requirements, keeping records, and returning funds in the event of withdrawal from the program.
- F. Normally at the end of the fifth year upon the completion of all of the core and major degree requirements at UD and the completion of all of the degree requirements at TWU, students will be granted a BS or BA degree in Biology from UD and a BS degree in Nursing from TWU. Students who withdraw from this program and who have completed the undergraduate degree requirements at UD will be granted a BS or BA degree in Biology.
- G. Students who do not fulfill the requirements of this early admissions program are in no way precluded from applying to the Nursing Program at TWU through the usual process.

IV. EFFECTIVE DATES:

This agreement shall be effective on April 1, 2012 and expire on August 31, 2022. If notice of termination is not received before this expiration date, as specified in paragraph IV, this agreement shall be automatically renewed for a subsequent five-year term, after review and signature by both parties.

V. NOTICE OF TERMINATION:

- A. Either party may initiate termination of this joint agreement. Written notice of intent to terminate must be delivered by:
 - 1. TWU to the Dean of Constantin College, UD; or
 - 2. UD to the Dean of the College of Nursing, TWU.
- B. This written notice must be delivered at least 180 days prior to the effective date of termination.
- C. Students enrolled in this early admissions program at the time of termination of this joint agreement will be given the opportunity to complete the program in its entirety.

LETTER OF AGREEMENT FOR NURSING

In an effort to offer educational opportunities within the field of nursing for University of Dallas students, this early admissions agreement between University of Dallas and Texas Woman's University is being implemented as a formal agreement maximizing the educational strengths of both institutions.

- 2) The 4th and 5th years could be completed entirely at the Dallas campus of TWU.
- The above curriculum assumes students place at the Intermediate Language level on entering UD. Additional semesters or summer work will be needed if this is not true.
- 4) AP or IB credit will be accessed according to the UD code. Students may place out of some of the above classes with appropriate scores on AP and IB examinations.
- 5) Total Number of Hours = 174 semester hours.
